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**Web 2.0**~parts of the Internet that due to their design facilitate interactive information sharing and collaboration on the World Wide Web. Examples of Web 2.0 include web-based communities, social networking sites, video-sharing sites, wikis, blogs, and more. This is in contrast to non-interactive websites where static information is provided to the viewer.
