




Seating Arrangements

Seating Arrangements

Rows

- Encourage individual work
- Minimize cheating opportunity
- Effective for demos, tests, presentations
- Easy to supervise
- Discourages discussion & group work
- × Easily lose focus
- Uneven distribution of interaction
- × Difficult for T to get to SS

Big U

- *Easier to interact w/ whole class
- *Encourages discussion
- *Fosters connection between T and SS
- *Large "stage" area for demos/presentations
 - Not suitable for small group work.
 - May overwhelm/ overstimulate shy
 - May be hard to control behavior
 - Difficult for large classes to fit/discuss

Pods

- *Encourages student interaction
- *Creates more personal space & safe environment for students to express ideas.
- *Promotes collaboration/ teamwork
- *Flexible for strategic grouping
- *Good for small spaces
 - Increased noise, distraction
 - Less individual accountability



Being on task







Class social media




Passwords
